ORDINANCE NO. 2007-14

**AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 12,
"TRAFFIC" OF THE GENERAL REVISED**

**ORDINANCES OF THE TOWNSHIP OF DELRAN,
ESTABLISHING WEIGHT LIMITS, AND ADDING
ECHO AVENUE, COOPER STREET AND ONEDA
AVENUE TO THE LIST OF COVERED STREETS**

WHEREAS, the Township Council of the Township of Delran has determined that the safety of the motoring public and the efficient movement of traffic requires the amendment of certain “Weight Limit” zones and the addition of such zones on Echo Avenue, Cooper Street and Oneda Avenue within the Township; and

WHEREAS, the Township has determined that the streets covered are not through streets and the proposed weight limit is appropriate for these residential streets;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED AND ESTABLISHED, by the Township Council of the Township of Delran in the County of Burlington and State of New Jersey that Chapter 12, Section 12-8 and Chapter 12, Schedule XVIII, “Trucks Over Four Tons Excluded” of the Revised General Ordinances of the Township of Delran are amended as set forth herein.

Section One. Chapter 12, Section 12-8 is amended by deleting the current language and replacing it with the following:

§12-8. Trucks over five tons excluded from certain streets.

Except for pickup and delivery of materials, commercial trucks over five tons registered gross vehicle weight are hereby excluded from the streets or parts of streets described in Schedule XVIII attached to and made a part of this chapter. This exclusion shall not apply to school buses while picking up or dropping off students nor to emergency vehicles while responding to emergency situations.

Section Two. Chapter 12, Schedule XVIII is amended by replacing the word “four” in the title with the word “five”, by replacing the words “trucks over four tons’ gross weight” in the opening paragraph with “commercial trucks over five tons registered gross vehicle weight”, and by adding the following streets to the list of streets covered by the Schedule:

Name of Street	Location
Echo Avenue	Entire length
Cooper Street	Entire length
Oneda Avenue	Entire length

AND BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED AND ESTABLISHED that appropriate signs shall be erected promptly upon adoption of this ordinance;

AND BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED AND ESTABLISHED that this Ordinance shall become effective immediately upon adoption and publication in accordance with law.

The meeting was open to the public for comments.

Gloria Stephens, 67 Janeway Avenue, asked Council why they were raising the weight limit to five tons. Mr. Macey stated that Council feels certain residential vehicles may have exceeded the four ton limit and agreed to increase the limit to five tons.

There being no other comments the meeting was closed to the public

Mr. Macey made a motion, seconded by Mr. Hermansky to adopt the ordinance on second reading.

There being no question, the roll was called.
